Mountain & Moorland Novice**Qualifier for the NPS Scotland/Kilmannan Stud Novice Ridden Mountain & Moorland Championship**

Stallions, mares and geldings four years old and over, registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society stud book.

A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January in the current year, it has done any of the following:

- i Won an open affiliated mixed M&M Ridden class
- ii Qualified for Horse of the Year Show, LIHS or RIHS Open M&M Ridden classes
- iii Qualified for the M&M Novice or Intermediate Ridden final at the NPS Summer Championship show and the NPS Scotland/Kilmannan Stud Novice Finals (N.B. Ponies can compete as novices in this competition for two consecutive years provided they do not submit an entry to the final in the first year).
- iv. If a pony qualifies for Horse of the Year Show, LIHS or RIHS in its second year it is de-noviced and cannot compete in the Kilmannan Final at the Scone Finals.

A minimum of 6 ponies must be stripped in qualifying rounds. All ponies will be stripped in the Final.

The Burghley Lead Rein Working Sports Pony Qualifier

THE BSPS TOPSPEC LEAD REIN WORKING SPORTS PONY

Mare or gelding 4 years old and over not exceeding 122cm. Riders to have attained their 4th birthday by 1st January in the current year and not to have attained their 10th birthday by 1st January in the current year.

METHOD OF JUDGING

Ponies will enter the ring at the walk, they may be trotted altogether at the Judges' discretion.

They will be pulled into line and asked to perform an individual test around in a minimum of five obstacles and a maximum of seven, including jumping a maximum of three small upright fences not exceeding 30cms No spread fences. Water will not be included.

Ponies will not be asked to walk on artificial material e.g., plastic sheeting during the test.

Riders will not be asked to dismount.

The Leader must be 16yrs. old or over and may only lead one pony in a class.

The rein **MUST** go directly from the bit to the rider's hand, with no extra aids or attachments to or on the saddle.

Handles on saddles are permitted, but the reins must not be attached to the handle or to the saddle.

The Lead rein must be affixed to the noseband on which it must remain while the pony is in the ring.

Whilst in the ring, ponies must be led by the leader at all times.

The Leaders must lead on the near side with the lead rein in the left hand.

DRESS CODE

Riders– Hats and Body Protectors in accordance with BSPS Rules. Tweed jackets, beige or cream jodhpurs,

Shirts, tie, boots and gloves. No Buttonholes.

Leaders – Country attire, Gentleman Trilby Hats or Caps, Ladies modest hats.

MARKS

Way of going, Manners and style whilst performing the test (Including jumping) 60 Marks.

Type and Freedom of Action 20 Marks

Presentation, condition and suitability of pony for rider 20 Marks

TOTAL 100 Marks

Judges will penalise refusals, knockdowns or taking the wrong course.

A stride or two of canter over the fences will not be penalised.

There will be NO conformation marks.

NEW BSPS USE OF A BATON WHIP RULE

- Hind boots are not permitted.

- Body protectors MUST be worn when jumping in any WHP Classes including practice ring.

- A BETA approved and appropriately labelled “Level 3 body protector” with the year 2018 (Blue and Black) shown on the label. BETA recommends body protectors are replaced at least every three to five years, after which the impact absorption properties of the foam may have started to decline.

- No change of saddlery is allowed between phases.

RULES AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

All BSPS members and show exhibitors agree to comply with the rules laid out in the current BSPS Rule Book. This includes but is not limited to rules regarding dope testing, good conduct and discipline and the social media and internet policy. It is necessary all exhibitors carry Public Liability Insurance for an adequate indemnity to protect against their negligence including any injury caused by their animals or property.

Conditions of Entry & Rules:

- This Show is Affiliated to the British Show Pony Society and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in the B.S.P.S. Classes, whether or not Members of the B.S.P.S. are subject to the Constitution and Rules of the B.S.P.S., including disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the B.S.P.S.
- Neither the BSPS Scottish Branch Committee, nor any of its Officers, Servants, or Assistants shall be responsible or accountable for any loss, injury or damage to any person, animal, or property in connection with this Show.
- Entry fees are non-refundable if the show must be cancelled due to weather conditions which are out with the control of the BSPS Scottish Branch. Please check website for up to date information on the show. Entries are also not transferable to other riders, ponies or classes.
- EQUINE PASSPORTS/INFLUENZA VACCINATION CERTIFICATES. Exhibitors are required to have Passports for all horses/ponies when competing at the show and up to date Equine Inoculation Certificate for each of their exhibits in accordance with the current BSPS Rule and Show Handbook. Any exhibitor found without a passport or valid certificates for all their animals will be asked to leave the Showground.
- Entries will not be accepted without the appropriate fee. No numbers will be sent to Exhibitors prior to the Show. Competitors' numbers should be collected from the Secretary's Office on the Show Ground. NO entries will be accepted over the telephone.
- NO REFUND OF ENTRIES WILL BE MADE. Entries cannot be changed, substituted or amended once received.
- OBJECTIONS must be made in writing with the objector's full name and address within 60 minutes of the completion of judging and must be lodged at the Secretary's Office together with the sum of £50 deposit. This sum will be returned if the objection is sustained, but if the objection is not sustained the deposit will be forfeited. Any objection against the judging of a class or championship must be referred to the BSPS in accordance with the Rules in the current BSPS Rule and Show Hand Book.

HATS

43. Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PAS015 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 and 2023, SNELL E2016 and E2021 onwards, **MUST** be worn by riders at all times when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover, either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. Velvet covers are encouraged. The B.S.P.S. encourages members to have their hats tagged through the B.S.P.S. scheme or via the Pony Club Scheme. Tagging indicates the hat meets the accepted standards, no check of the fit or condition of the hat is implied. It is considered to be the responsibility of the members/guardians to ensure the hat complies with current standards and is tagged before they compete. Members/guardians are responsible for ensuring the manufacturer's guidelines with regard to fit and replacement are followed.

BODY PROTECTORS

50. Body Protectors **MUST** be worn when jumping in any WHP and WH classes, Including practice rings at B.S.P.S. affiliated shows. (Including Tiny Tots, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WSP, LRWSP and Training Stakes). Riders must wear a body protector when working in (practice jumps) and the jumping phase in all B.S.P.S. organised and affiliated events. A British Equestrian Trade Association (BETA) approved and appropriately labelled "Level 3 body protector" 2018 (Blue) shown on the label. BETA recommends body protectors are replaced at least every three to five years, after which the impact absorption properties of the foam may have started to decline.

Air Jackets may be worn. If a member chooses to wear an air jacket they are allowed in addition to a normal body protector, which meets BETA 2018 level 3 standard. Air jackets must not be worn under any jacket or body protector and numbers must be fitted with elasticated fastenings .

When an air jacket inflates the sudden noise can startle horses, thereby, causing difficulties for other members if used in confined areas, eg, indoor schools and ménage's. Therefore, air jackets are not encouraged to be used in those areas except for medical reasons.

SPURS

51. The wearing of spurs in ALL classes held under B.S.P.S. Rules is forbidden. Spurs or dummy spurs must not be used when working in.

WHIPS

52. In ALL classes held under B.S.P.S. Rules whips are not to exceed 75cms (30ins). Hunting Crops are permissible. This includes whips/sticks used by leaders in lead rein classes. Padded whips are recommended for WHP classes. A whip, if carried, must be held in the hand by the handle with the handle at the top.

At all times the whip must be used; For a good reason, as an aid to encourage the horse/pony forward. At an appropriate time, namely when the horse/pony is reluctant to go forward with the normal aids of seat and legs. In the right place, namely down the shoulder or behind the leg. Never over arm. With appropriate severity. No more than twice for any incident. Riders must not hit a horse/pony before the start of a jumping course.

Excessive use of a whip anywhere on a showground will result in disqualification of the horse and rider from any classes entered on that day.

This includes, but not limited to;

Use of the whip to vent a competitor's anger is always excessive.

Use of the whip which causes injury, e.g. broken skin or weal is always excessive.

Use after elimination or retirement is always excessive.

Use on the horse/pony's head and neck is always excessive.

Using a whip from the ground after a fall or dismount is always excessive.

If the rider's arm comes above the shoulder when using the whip this is always excessive.

From 2026, in WHP and WSP classes riders must only use a baton whip.

Judging:

- Each Exhibitor shall abide by and accept as final the decision of the Judges, Referees, Chief Steward and Officials of the Show.
- Classes will be Judged in accordance with the current BSPS Rule Book.
- The Judges listed in the Schedule have accepted our invitation to Judge, but the Committee reserve the right to appoint substitutes should any Judge withdraw.
- No Exhibitor may knowingly show a pony under a Judge in circumstances that would constitute a breach of Rules by the Judge.
- The BSPS Scottish Branch/Board of Directors reserve the right to move, change, amalgamate or divide any class, championship or supreme as they deem fit when necessary to facilitate the running of the show. It is therefore the competitor's responsibility to keep up to date with any changes which may occur during the running of the show.

- *No marks will be displayed until after the presentation of awards.*

Dope Testing:

- *Any animal taking part in BSPS Shows or shows affiliated to BSPS are liable to Dope Testing*

Trophies

- *All Trophy winners must be members of BSPS Scotland. An ADULT must sign for the Trophy, and agree to return when requested by the BSPS Scotland, in a good, clean condition. All breakages will be charged for.*

General:

- *Only tack that is permissible in the ring in BSPS classes are allowed on the showground*
- *Mounted exhibitors must adhere to horse walkways and riding areas.*
- *Motorised vehicles including scooters are not allowed on the showfields.*
- *Ponies must not be left overnight in trailers or horseboxes. Coralling is not permitted.*
- *The current welfare policy will be enforced at every show.*
- *Only animals entered in classes at the BSPS Scottish Branch Ltd Show may use the arenas for exercising.*

Liability:

- *Neither the BSPS or any of its officers, assistants or stewards shall in any way be responsible for any loss, injury or damages that may happen to exhibitors or their assistants or other members of the public, or to any animal or property or to any vehicle brought into the Showground or on any premises used in conjunction with the Show, or while entering or leaving the same.*
- *BSPS shall not be liable to the show entrants in contract, tort, negligence, breach of statutory duty or otherwise for any loss, damage, costs or expenses of any nature whatsoever incurred or suffered by the show entrants of an indirect or consequential nature including without limitation any economic loss or other loss of turnover, profits, business or goodwill. Any notice served in accordance with this clause shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given if left at or sent by post or telex or facsimile to the entrant at the address or relevant telecommunications number for such entrant or such other address as the entrant may from time to time designate*
- *It is necessary all exhibitors carry Public Liability Insurance for an adequate indemnity to protect against their negligence including any injury caused by their animals or property.*

Conduct:

- *Rule 67 - No member of the BSPS shall conduct himself in a manner or be guilty of behaviour which is derogatory to the character or prejudicial to the interests of the BSPS and in particular (but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing) no Member shall behave in an offensive or abusive or unpleasant matter to any person at any show or at any other location where BSPS business is being transacted or via social media or the internet or via any publication in whatever format or via any other written or electronic format. Members' attention is drawn to the BSPS Social Media and Internet Policy set out in the back of the BSPS Handbook.*
- *Rule 70 – Members are responsible for the actions of any non-members who are Family Members (as defined below) or who are friends or friends of Family Members or who are employed by them or assisting, supporting or representing them or otherwise acting on their behalf and any action or conduct of such non-member which would be a breach of the Rules were he a Member shall constitute a breach of the Rules by the Member concerned. Family Member shall include a spouse or civil partner, a partner, a direct descendant or ascendant of the Member or his spouse or civil partner, brothers, sisters or adopted children of the Member or his spouse or civil partner, or any other person who is part of the same household as the Member or is in the reasonable opinion of the BSPS a member of the Member's family in the widest sense.*

QUALIFYING INFORMATION

This Show is a qualifier for the 2026 BPS Championships Show to be held at Arena UK. The 1st and 2nd prize winners only in the following classes Open LR, FR, SP, NS and the 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize winners in Classes Open Intermediate SRT (including Mixed height), W.H & SHT, CS the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th prize winners in mixed height classes will qualify for the BPS Championships provided the animal is registered in accordance with Rules 5, 21 and 26 and ridden by a BPS member.

1st Prizewinners in qualifying classes will receive £5 prizemoney. All prizemoney must be collected on the day of the show prior to secretaries office closing & before the supreme of show. Any prizemoney not collected will be forfeited.

THE BPS CHALLENGE

This show is a qualifier for the BSPS Challenge. Animals competing in the following Open classes will qualify; Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Lead Rein of Hunter Type, Show Pony, SHP, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WHP, Intermediate SRH, Hack, SH and WH and Open Heritage Lead Rein, First Ridden, Ridden and WHP Classes.

THE B.S.P.S. ANTHONY EVANS INSURANCE CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS

At ALL B.S.P.S. affiliated shows the 1st Prize winners in the following classes will qualify for The Champion of Champions:- Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Open Show Ponies, Open WHP, Open SHP, Open LRHT, Open FRHT, Open Intermediates and Open Heritage Lead Rein, First Ridden, Ridden and WHP Classes.

THE B.S.P.S. ANTHONY EVANS INSURANCE MINI WHP CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS

At ALL B.S.P.S. affiliated shows the 1st prize winners in the Open Cradle and Nursery Stakes will qualify for The Mini WHP Champion of Champions

THE ROYAL HIGHLAND SHOW – NURSERY STAKES

This show is a qualifier for The Royal Highland Show Nursery Stakes 2026. The first 4 placed pony and rider combinations will qualify for the 2026 Royal Highland Show Nursery Stakes provided they have jumped a clear round. Qualification will only move down the line to the next eligible pony and rider combination meeting the qualification criteria. This class is open to both BSPS Members and Non-Members but owner and rider must be BSPS members to enter the final.

BSPS SCOTLAND TRAINING STAKES CHAMPIONSHIP

BSPS Scotland Training Stakes Series: Ponies placed first & second in the 60cm, 70cm and 80cm training stakes classes will qualify for the Championships held at the BSPS Scotland Finale Show on 12th September 2026. Qualification may go down to fourth place if higher placed ponies have previously qualified – only those who have jumped a clear round can qualify. If a combination qualifies in all three height categories they are only able to compete in the two higher height classes at the final.

NPS SCOTLAND QUALIFIERS – RULES 2026

To be run under NPS SCOTLAND CHAMPIONSHIPS RULES 2026. These rules clarify areas particular to NPS Scotland. We also run to the Rules of the National Pony Society. Copies of these rules can be found on our website www.npsscotland.co.uk

Exhibitors are deemed to be conversant with these rules.

A judge is not obliged to award an NPS Scotland Qualification if he/she feels that the pony is not of a sufficient standard.

Caledonian Showing Championships

This show is a qualifier for the Caledonian Showing Championships, which is now fully established as the biggest and best way to end Scottish showing season

Every horse & pony placed 1st in all Inhand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) & Working Hunter/Ponyclasses will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. All Champions & Reserves will qualify for the Champion & Reserves Stakes Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line.

BURGHLEY GOLD CUP QUALIFIER

GENERAL RULES

1. ELIGIBILITY: -Open to ponies and riders who are eligible to compete in B.S.P.S. classes.

2. DRESS

As permitted in the current BSPS Rule & Show Handbook and compliant with Sections B, C and D.

Hats must be in accordance with B.S.P.S. Rules.

A competitor whose hat comes off, or chin strap comes undone whilst competing must on penalty of elimination replace it or do it up before continuing.

Whips are permitted for all phases, but they must not exceed 75cms (30ins). Baton whips only to be used in the jumping phases. Dressage whips are permitted in the dressage warm-up, but whips used during the dressage test must be BSPS legal.

3 CLASSES

Four Sections according to Height of Fences:-

1. Nursery Stakes – Mare or gelding 4 years old or over not exceeding 133cm. Riders not to have attained their 13th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Height of fences 75cm for the WHP and 80cm for the showjumping. **This class is not a qualifier for the final.**

2. Not exceeding 138cms Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Riders not to have attained their 15th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Height of fences in the qualifying rounds 85cm for WHP and 90cm for show jumping. Height of fences at the final 90cm for WHP and 95cm for show jumping.

3. Not exceeding 148cm Mare or gelding 4 years old or over. Riders not to have attained their 18th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Height of fences in the qualifying rounds 95cm for WHP and 100cm for show jumping. Height of fences at the final 100cm for WHP and 105 cm for show jumping

4. Not exceeding 158cms Mare or gelding 4 years old or over. Riders not to have attained their 25th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Height of fences in the qualifying rounds 105cm for WHP and 110cm for show jumping. Height at the final 110cm for WHP and 115cm for show jumping.

The highest placed pony in each class qualifies.

Gold Cup Classes consist of:

Section. A - Dressage, Nursery Stakes - PC Grassroots PC80 Dressage Test 2026

138cm, 148cm, 158cm - PC Novice PC90 Dressage Test 2026

Dressage tests may be commanded in the Nursery Stakes only.

Section. B - WSP (replaces WHP as marks are based on Style & Performance)

Section. C - Show Jumping (timed with penalties for exceeding the time allowed and optional Joker fence which is placed within the timed course).

The same pony and rider combination can only qualify in one section, and must qualify in the first class they qualify in.

Riders must be the correct age for the height of the pony they ride.

General Rules

1. It is permitted to change Saddlery between Sections A and B (and Section C if applicable).

2. The Dressage Test to be ridden before the W.S.P. Phase, except at the BSPS Championship Shows when this may not be possible.

3. Rules for jumping the WSP and Show Jumping sections will be as for W.H.P. classes.

4. Shoeing and Leg protection for the WSP and Show Jumping Sections, will be as permitted within the BSPS WHP classes.

5. Height of fences for the WSP and Show Jumping phases will be in accordance with the Class description (see Section 3). At the finals of the Gold Cup, the Course Builders are permitted an extra 5cms increase in the maximum heights of fences

6 A fall of pony or rider in any Section will result in elimination in that phase.

B.S.P.S. WINTER WORKER STAKES

- 1. 60cm Worker Stakes** Plaited or Heritage Mountain and Moorland Ponies 4yrs old and over not exceeding 158cms. Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony/horse they ride. **An Award Card for the highest placed rider under 12yrs of age on 1st January in the current year in this class who will also qualify for the B.S.P.S. Winter Championships.**
- 2. 70cm Worker Stakes** Plaited or Heritage Mountain and Moorland ponies, 4yrs old and over not exceeding 158cms. Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony/horse they ride. **An Award Card for the highest placed rider under 14yrs of age on 1st January in the current year in this class who will also qualify for the B.S.P.S. Winter Championships.**
- 3. 80cm Worker Stakes** Plaited or Heritage Mountain and Moorland ponies, 4yrs old and over not exceeding 158cms. Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony/horse they ride. **An Award Card for the highest placed rider under 18yrs of age on 1st January in the current year in this class who will also qualify for the B.S.P.S. Winter Championships.**
- 4. 90cm Worker Stakes** Plaited or Heritage Mountain and Moorland ponies, 4yrs old and over not exceeding 158cms. Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony/horse they ride. **An Award Card for the highest placed rider under 18yrs of age on 1st January in the current year in this class who will also qualify for the B.S.P.S. Winter Championships.**
- 5. 100cm Worker Stakes** Plaited or Heritage Mountain and Moorland ponies, 4yrs old and over not exceeding 158cms. Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony/horse they ride. **An Award Card for the highest placed rider under 25yrs of age on 1st January in the current year in this class who will also qualify for the B.S.P.S. Winter Championships.**

N.B. Ponies may compete in more than one height section. Rider should be appropriate age 1st January in the current year.

The Highest placed 3 ponies will qualify for the B.S.P.S. Winter Championships together with the highest placed junior rider.

FENCES

There must be a minimum of 8 fences up to a maximum of 12 fences. Two judges may be used for these classes if numbers warrant.

Marks will be awarded:-

Jumping 70 marks

Style whilst Jumping 30 marks

Conformation and way of going 20 marks

Total 120 marks

Method of Judging – One Judge – If using one judge, the exhibitor will enter the ring and present themselves to the judge. The judge will judge the pony for conformation, the exhibitor will then be asked to walk away and trot back before commencing their jumping round. (Front boots can be worn) (Conformation phase)

At the end of the jumping round the exhibitor will extend (gallop) canter, trot, walk and halt. (way of going phase). The judge will then allocate the style while jumping mark (out of 30) and the conformation and way of going out of 20, (10/10 split)

Two judges – judge one will judge the jumping round allocating up to 30 marks for style while jumping. The exhibitor will then go to phase 2 with judge two. Front boots to be removed. Exhibitors will complete a short show as directed by the judge. Ponies will not be stripped. The judge will allocate 20 marks for conformation and way of going. (10/10 split)
